The winner of the **Partnership with the NHS Award** went to [Medcura](#) for their partnership with University Hospitals Southampton (UHS) NHS Foundation Trust to improve healthcare outcomes for cancer patients by increasing the quality, safety and efficiency of IV Chemotherapy and in turn making service provision more efficient.

The next winner was for **Start-Up** and this was awarded to [Oxford Heartbeat](#) for their technology to make cardiovascular surgeries more accurate and safe. Their technology helps clinicians accurately plan and rehearse stent placements inside blood vessels.

The final award of the evening went to [xim](#) for **Outstanding Achievement** for their achievements in developing their innovative Lifelight Technology (Lifelight™) which provides early warning of critical health events through non-contact, camera based vital signs monitoring using cameras built into smart phones, tablets, computers and smart televisions.
